Flu vaccination programme 2023 to 2024

The Flu vaccination is safe and effective. It is offered every year through the NHS to help protect people at risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

Flu vaccination is important because, while flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life threatening for some people, particularly those with certain health conditions.

The best time to have your flu vaccine is in the autumn or early winter before flu starts spreading.

The flu vaccine is given free on the NHS to adults who:

- are 65 and over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2024)
- have certain health conditions
- are pregnant
- are in long-stay residential care
- Main carer, or the informal carer for an older or disabled person who may be at risk if you get sick
- live with someone who is more likely to get a severe infection due to a weakened immune system, such as someone living with HIV, someone who has had a transplant, or is having certain treatments for cancer, lupus or rheumatoid arthritis

Enhanced Access Service

The Enhanced Access and Extended Access programme enables patients convenient access to healthcare services outside of core GP hours. Services can also be delivered to patients remotely, making access even easier compared to before.

Services such as GP appointments, Blood tests, Smear tests, Nurse clinics (e.g. diabetic reviews, foot checks, asthma reviews etc)

If you would like an appointment outside of what we can offer or on a Saturday or Sunday ask a reception staff and we will book you in to the available clinics.
